LITURGICAL USE:

1. Entrance procession -- as written, repeating the refrain after each pair of verses. Four or eight singers might be placed in the chancel to sing the polyphony. If desired, a Station could be made at the chancel step. The choir would pause after the repetition of the refrain when the Celebrant reaches the foot of the Rood; the Celebrant would chant an appropriate verse and Collect, such as:

V. - Arise and shine, O Jerusalem, for thy light is come:
R. - And the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee.

Let us pray: Almighty God, who hast poured upon us the new light of thine incarnate Word: grant that the same light enkindled in our hearts may shine forth in our lives. Through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee in the Unity of the Holy Ghost, One God, world without end.

R. - Amen.

Then the chant would resume as the procession moves into the chancel.

Gloria Patri must not be sung until all are in place and the incensation of the altar is completed. If the Psalm ends before that, the organist will extemporise until the incensations are done; then the chanters will intone "Gloria Patri" and the refrain will be sung one last time.

2. Lesson Chant -- The Psalm may be sung entire, without refrain or Gloria Patri; or verses may be selected, and the refrain be repeated after each pair of verses.

3. Offertory or Communion procession -- As at the entrance, with refrain and Gloria Patri.
